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| <p>At Reigate Park Primary Art and Design is a subject area which we celebrate and enjoy across the school. Our intent is to ensure that our curriculum inspires our children to think creatively and gain an appreciation of art.</p> <p>Art and design is integrated into our curriculum through the cross-curricular projects taught in every year group. This ensures the art curriculum is relevant and meaningful to the children, and enables them to apply their cross curricular knowledge to their art and design work.</p> <p>Our Art and Design curriculum is aimed at providing our children with opportunities to develop their skills using a range of media and materials. Children learn the skills of drawing, painting, printing, collage, textiles, 3D work and digital art. They are given the opportunity to explore and evaluate different creative ideas.</p> <p>In EYFS children will be taught to:</p> <p>In Key Stage 1 children will be taught:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination</li> <li>• to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space</li> </ul> | <p>Our Art and Design curriculum is broken into year group progression of skills and knowledge. Through this, year group will learn a range of skills and techniques, use different mediums and develop the ability to experiment with different kinds of art, craft and design whilst increasing the children's awareness and appreciation of art.</p> <p>Art and Design is integrated into our Curriculum Maestro projects to enable the learning to be meaningful to the children. These lessons may be taught weekly or as a block as appropriate.</p> <p>Local, national and international artists are explored to enhance children's knowledge and skills.</p> | <p>Our Art and Design Curriculum is high quality, well thought out and planned to demonstrate progression.</p> <p>If children are developing the skills taught in their year group, they are deemed to be making good or better progress.</p> <p>Through our curriculum:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children have the knowledge and vocabulary to appreciate and can talk about different artists.</li> <li>• Children showcase the mastery of skills and knowledge.</li> </ul> <p>In addition, we measure the impact of our curriculum through the following methods:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A reflection on standards achieved against the planned outcomes</li> <li>• Pupil discussion about their learning which includes their thoughts, ideas, processing and evaluation of their work.</li> </ul> |
