Our Topic this Half Term is 'Britain at War'

In the Britain at War project, we will be learning about the main causes of the First World War and which countries were the major players. We will investigate why so many men volunteered to fight and then sequence the events at the start of the war. We will listen to first-hand accounts of life on the home front and evaluate the impact of war on everyday life. They will also discover the events that led to the Allied Powers' victory and the consequences of the Treaty of Versailles. The children will also learn about the causes and main events of the Second World War. We will find out how Britain prepared itself for war and the war's impact on civilian life and will learn about the Battle of Britain and how it proved to be a key turning point for the Allied Powers. We will research the causes and consequences of the end of the Second World War and investigate the legacy of the wars in Britain. Closer to home, the children will research the life of a local First World War hero who sacrificed their life fighting for Britain. We will also investigate the legacy of these global conflicts in the post-war period.

English

This half term we will be learning to write: a diary entry based on the book 'Letters from a Lighthouse' and a balanced argument about whether children should have been evacuated from their home during the war. We will be using the texts: Letters from a Lighthouse – Emma Carroll; World War II - Dorling Kindersley; Rose Blanche - Roberto Innocenti; Explore World War 2 - Jane Bingham; World War I - Dorling Kindersley; War Horse - Michael Morpurgo and The Story of World War One - Richard Brassey

How you could help your child prepare for the topic...

Why not visit a local museum together to investigate how the Second World War affected your local area? You could also read an exciting fiction book set during the war. Alternatively, you could 'make do and mend', working together to create a model inspired by the Second World War from recycled materials or unwanted household items.

Maths

Our learning for this half term will be:

- Multiplying and dividing decimals
- Simplifying, adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing fractions
- Percentages
- Measurement
- Interpreting data
